


Matsuura Factory




Hotel: Tsuruya

How to dress in Yukata

Yukata are a traditional garment, similar in style to Kimono, but lighter, much more casual, and made of cotton. Yukata function both as a bathrobe and loungewear, which can be worn at all times during your stay, including to the bath, to both dinner and breakfast, and to bed as sleepwear.

To wear Yukata, here are the six steps:

- 1. Put on your yukata over your underwear. Slip your arms into the sleeves of the Yukata and grasp it along its front hem, one side in each hand, at about your waist level. Fold the right hand side underneath the left hand side, and hold it in place with your hand.
- 2. Now fold the left hand over the right hand side and hold it in place with your hand while you get your obi (belt).



- 3. Secure everything in place with the obi (belt) by wrapping it around your waist. Begin in the front and wrap it around your back.
- 4. Cross the belt around your back and tie it in the front. For men, the belt should rest fairly low on the hips. For women, the belt is tied at the waist.



5. Adjust the length of the belt ends so that they hang evenly from your right hip. Then adjust the knot so that it lies on your right hip.

6. In cooler weather, the outer jacket can be worn over the yukata like a coat. Yukata coats have ties at chest level with which they can be secured, and may have a pocket for carrying small items such as your room key. Alternatively, yukata coat sleeves are designed so that items can be carried inside.

*How to wear Samue *

Originally 'Samue' is a garment that a zen (Buddhist) monk wears when he performs samu, or duties such as daily sutra chanting, and the cleaning of the precincts of the temple.

Nowadays it is used as a male informal wear and worn at home as loungewear and pajamas.



To wear Samue, here are the three steps:

- 1. Put on the pants and tie as you prefer it at the waist.
- 2. Put on the jacket by wrapping the left over the right side of your waist.
- 3. Take the two ropes from the left and right side and tie them up to close your garment.

The only thing to remember when tying the jacket, as with all traditional Japanese clothing, is to bring the left side over the right side, so that the jacket is tied on the right side. The sleeves and legs of the pants are sometimes equipped with a drawstring to adjust the tightness.

NOTE: Hotel staff will enter your room to help you wearing Samue!

*How to take Japanese hot spring (Onsen) *

1. In the dressing room

When getting into an onsen in Japan, you must be fully naked. Take off all of your clothes in the dressing room.

If you are uncomfortable being naked, you can use your small hand towel to hide your private parts when you are moving from dressing room to bathing area and back again.

Put your clothes in a locker.



2. Before getting in the bath

Please wash your body in the washing area before getting into the bath.

Please be careful not to splash hot water around you.

Clean the bathing stool and bucket after you are done using them, and return them to their original position.

Pour warm water over your body using a bucket starting with your wrists and ankles, then arms, legs, lower back and shoulders. This is called 'Kakeyu'.

'Kakeyu' prevents the sudden rise of blood pressure, and helps you get used to the temperature of water.

Enter the bath slowly, soak up to the pit of your stomach first.

3. After bathing

Wipe down your body lightly with your towel before going back to the dressing room. Relax and drink lots of water to stay hydrated after bathing.

Be sure to stay warm after the bath.

Things not to do at the Onsen

- · Do not run or swim in the bath.
- Do not wash your body in the bath. Wash your body in the washing area.
- · Do not soak your towel or hair in the bath.
- Do not speak too loudly.
- · Avoid taking a bath right after dining or drinking alcohol.
- · Swimsuits are not allowed.



Takefu Knife Village

Located in Echizen (Takefu) city, Fukui prefecture Japan.

Echizen city is one of the most remarkable places on the knifemaking map of Japan and there are many knife makers in this city. Takefu Knife Village is a cooperative association, consists of 13 knife companies.

More than 40 craftsmen work together to create great knives. 17 out of 40 craftsmen are certified as the traditional craftsmen.

Hotel: Kyoto Tokyu Hotel

Located approx. 5 minutes by car from Kyoto station. A world heritage and the head temple of the Jodo Shinryu Nishi Honganji temple is located within a walk distance.





Dinner: TSURUSE

Tsuruse stands by the Gojo-ohashi bridge, with its glorious castle casting a shadow in the clear stream of the Kamo River. They still offer a ritzy history with their three-storied wooden structure and all-cypress used construction.

Tsuruse represents the atmospheric Kyoto, with its tranquil atmosphere offering spectacular view of gentle ranges of Higashiyama across Kamo River.

Enjoy traditional Japanese cuisine and performances by Maiko and Geisha!











NOTE: No strict dress code, however, please avoid overly casual clothing such as sandals, shorts, cap, etc. Also, please refrain from wearing strong perfumes.



1 Kawaramachi Street

Kawaramachi Street is now a main street of Kyoto. You can enjoy shopping at department store or shops.





②Yasaka-jinja Shrine

One of the sponsors of the Gion Festival, the Yasaka Shrine is beloved by locals. It attracts many visitors throughout the year, especially during the Gion Festival in July, but also on New Year's Eve, as well as during the spring (for cherry blossom viewing) and autumn (for fall colors).





3Gion District

You can catch a sight of maiko and geiko walking through the elegant streets of Gion, one of the big downtown districts in Kyoto originally developed in the Middle Ages.







4Ponto-cho

This street was named from the English word "point" and the Portuguese word "ponta" (point). In contrast to the hustle and bustle of Kawaramachi, the narrow end of this street, which has a quiet atmosphere, is lined with old ryotei (restaurants) and chaya (geisha houses).

Sightseeing: NIjo-jo (Nijo Castle)

Known as the Kyoto residence of the famous leader Tokugawa leyasu (the first shogun of the Edo Period), Nijō Castle is a stronghold that represents the prestige and power of the mighty leader known as the unifier of Japan. Construction on the castle was begun in 1601 and finished 25 years later by leyasu's grandson lemitsu. In 1939, the castle was donated to the city of Kyoto and was officially opened to the public. Enjoy exploring and learning about leyasu's dramatic and interesting life - no one said history had to be boring! With hundreds of varieties of flora as well, Nijō-jō is also a great place to view some of Japan's treasured seasonal beauty.







Sightseeing: Kinkakuji Temple

Temple of the Golden Pavilion, also known as Rokuon-ji (Deer Garden Temple), is a Zen Buddhist temple in Kyoto, Japan. The garden complex is an excellent example of Muromachi period garden design. It is designated as a National Special Historic Site and a National Special Landscape, and it is one of 17 locations comprising the Historic Monuments of Ancient Kyoto World Heritage Site

Sightseeing: Kyoto Tower


Kyoto tower is an observation tower located in Kyoto. Standing 131 meters tall just across from Kyoto station. The steel tower is the tallest structure in Kyoto and a rare modern iconic landmark in the city famous for its ancient temples and shrines. The tower was completed in 1964, the same year as the opening of the Shinkansen (bullet train) and the Tokyo Olympics.

An observation deck is located at 100 meters (328ft) above ground and affords a 360 degree view of Kyoto and as far as Osaka on clear days.

The 800-ton tower stands atop a 9-story building, which houses a 3-star hotel and several stores.








Sightseeing: Sanjusangendo Temple

A temple built by the famous warlord Taira no Kiyomori for Emperor Go-Shirakawa in 1164, Sanjūsangen-dō is primarily famous for its 1,001 statues of Kannon, the goddess of compassion in her thousand-armed incarnation, lined up along the entire length of the thirty-three ken (unit of measurement) hall from which the temple gets its moniker. The temple complex used to be larger until a fire decimated it and only the main hall was rebuilt, but visitors are more than satisfied with the impressive contents of the long wooden structure. Not only is the hall filled with the golden faces of a thousand Kannon statues, but another 28 sculptures of Buddhist guardian deities are also featured in the front row. The hall itself shows its age in the many arrow notches that can be found in the wood on the edge of the building, marks of the Tōshiya archery competition once held at the temple hundreds of years ago.
